### WORKSHOP—Storage, Handling & Risk Management

Dangerous goods risk assessments and other legislative requirements must now be completed. Storage and handling requirements of dangerous goods now resides under the **Occupational Health and Safety Regulation 2005**. The regulation requires written risk assessments to be undertaken on the storage and handling of all dangerous goods with fines applying if these are not done. Changes to placarding, keeping of records and use of Australian Standards have been made as well as notification requirements to WorkCover and NSW Fire Brigades. In addition this workshop will cover the recently updated and significantly changed **7<sup>th</sup> edition of the ADG Code**.

This is a practical half-day introductory workshop designed to get participants up to speed on NSW's recent dangerous goods laws. **Australian Standards** are used as a standard set of control measures, to comply with the new regulations. The Code of Practice is also referred to in the Workshop on how to comply with the regulations. Supporting case studies are used to take participants through a realistic assessment of dangerous goods storages case studies to be assessed on compliance.

**Facilitator:** Andrew Doig, Director AEBN Pty Ltd who is an excellent facilitator and has a broad background with dangerous goods, its storage and handling and management, leads this Workshop.
