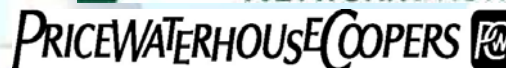

DESCRIPTION OF WORKSHOP

The *National Greenhouse and Energy Reporting (NGER) Regulations* requires the first reports due by **31 October 2009**.

This seminar provides the opportunity to clarify any uncertainty regarding the obligations under this legislation and to undertake an important check of the accuracy and completeness of your lodgment.

Further complicating the reporting requirements are the on-going changes to the NGER determinations including the July 2009 amendments.

This workshop will provide participants with a clear understanding of your obligations. It will demonstrate how business should be measuring, gathering and collating data, It will also discuss the Federal Government's reporting database, *Online System for Comprehensive Activity Reporting (OSCAR)* and the progress made to upload company data files.

The workshop will provide participants with:

- An analysis of the sources of data and methodologies for the collection and maintenance of the data
